

# Dinosaur Writing Prompts

## Instructions:


Print the pages.

Have your student choose a writing prompt and a writing page.

Show your student the word bank as an additional way to help generate ideas.

Students could also create their own writing prompts and use the pages to record their ideas and stories.

Encourage students to proofread their work when finished.



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# Dinosaur Writing Prompts

#1: You find a dinosaur in the wild. What will you do?

#2: Write all about your pet dinosaur. What does your dinosaur eat? Where does he sleep? Does he wear clothes? Does he have hobbies? Include details.

#3: You found a strange egg in the chicken coop. You put it in an incubator and something hatched, but it wasn't a chicken! What was in the egg? Write a story about your experience.

#4: You traveled back in time to the land of dinosaurs. What was your visit like? What did you see? What did you do?

#5: You went on a dinosaur dig and found bones from a species that has never been discovered! What will you name your dinosaur? Describe its size, shape, teeth, and anything else you learned from the skeleton.

#6: Research one of the dinosaurs in the word bank. Record your findings on one of the journal pages.
